Class Communication

This summer, your child's teachers are working together to create a communication protocol that will be consistent with one another and helpful for all of our students and parents. They will use that information to create a cohesive communication plan for announcing and scheduling homework, quizzes, tests, and class news.

The communication protocol will be fine tuned throughout the rest of the summer and then shared with you on the night of the Opening Ceremony during a “breakout session” for 4th-8th grade families. This will give you an opportunity to ask questions and will afford us the preparation needed to start the year with clarity and confidence. Additionally, Devan (PTO president) and the PTO are working on recruiting and assigning volunteers to be “room moms” for each class. Let’s remember that the class team consists of students, teachers, administrators, volunteers, substitutes, and parents. Pray about the possibility of being a room mom or if another mom comes to mind, encourage her to sign up. We’re excited to take these next steps in growing our class community.
